Listening, Language and Learning for Infants and Children Who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing

This workshop will present foundational information on audiology, hearing technology, and the connection between hearing and spoken language so participants can begin to understand the critical role they can play for infants or children who listen with hearing aids, cochlear implants and/or FM systems. We will explore the exciting opportunities for children who are deaf or hard of hearing as a result of universal newborn hearing screening, advanced hearing technologies and qualified professionals. An ideal program for professionals seeking the Listening and Spoken Specialist (LSLSTM) certification, professionals entering into the field of listening and spoken language, college or post-graduate students, administrators responsible for programs serving infants and children who are deaf or hard of hearing, or anyone seeking a comprehensive refresher on the foundations of listening and spoken language.

Improving Outcomes for Students who are Deaf and Hard of Hearing in the Mainstream

Students with hearing loss are general education students first and are expected to meet the same academic standards as their peers. Listening and spoken language strategies that support successful learning in the mainstream classroom will be explored through a presentation, video clips and discussion. Assessment techniques for progress monitoring will be described. Organizational tools for case management will be presented for itinerant and center-based teachers to maximize their ability to support students with hearing loss in their classroom. This dynamic session will promote idea-sharing to facilitate collaboration among professionals who support children with hearing loss in the mainstream. Both new and experienced professionals who specialize in working with children with hearing loss, general education teachers, and school administrators are invited to share their ideas and learn from others.
